Hampton resident Darrell Eifert is our featured artist for the months of September and October. Like many photographers, he fell into the craft almost by accident. After a trip to the Isle of Mull off the coast of Scotland in 2001, he returned with some black and white film of that magical place of hidden glens and ancient standing stones. What he saw as the pictures began to emerge from the developing tray convinced him to start a serious and lasting study of this most accessible and popular of modern art forms. Through voracious reading and much practice, he has since learned his way around Adobe Photoshop, and begun to explore the wonderful variety of new papers and inks specially formulated for precise control of a fine art print.



The images on display are representative of his work mainly from the seacoast and Lakes District towns of Great Britain, along with some favorite compositions from several castles and cathedrals.




Copies of the book are available at the library. Due to a limited number of copies, we are placing the book on reserve for interested patrons. All are welcome to participate.


